Autumn Triennial Tour to Northumberland

The triennial tour took place at the end of September with three rounds played over Goswick, Alnmouth and Dunstanburgh Castle Golf Clubs.

Good news for the attendees was that Dave Campbell was, unfortunately, unable to go on tour so that left the door open for others over the weekend!

Innes Christie, playing some excellent golf, took full advantage. On another very blustery day at Goswick, Innes Christie won with a fine score of 36 stableford points winning by two points from Ron "The Legend" Bradly.

Innes followed this up on Saturday at Dunstanburgh Castle with a 74 to win the Tawse Medal for the best scratch score. Gregor MacDonald, fortified by beans with his Full English breakfast, got back in the golfing groove with an excellent 41 points to win the Centenary Trophy.

A well-attended Charity Walk from Bamburgh Castle to Dunstanburgh Castle took place on the Saturday along both sides of the course and provided amusement and annoyance in equal measure on a day that will be fondly remembered by all. Who knew that Roman soldiers could be so much fun!

Sunday took us to Alnmouth where, on a glorious day, Grahame Clarke won the Smithy Salver with 36 stableford points, one ahead of Innes Christie.

Innes, with his scores at Goswick and Dunstanburgh won the Tantallon 1995 Cup for the best two aggregate scores.

The House competition, played over the three days, was won by Castle 2 with 279 stableford points, one point ahead of Castle 1. The other scores were Lauriston 268, Greyfriars 267 and Raeburn 232. The winning team was Innes Christie, not so ably supported by, Graham Hunt and Graham Tait.

Innes also won the Rosenbloom Cup and the Sivewright Trophy for the Aggregate Spring & Autumn handicap and scratch score at Lundin Links and Dunstanburgh Castle.
